The Bachelor of Arts in Anthropology is designed to serve the needs of students who do not plan to continue their training beyond the baccalaureate level, as well as those who intend to pursue their graduate study leading to the M.A. or Ph.D., either in anthropology or in another academic discipline.

The program is built around core theory and foundation courses and three course areas described below. The B.A. in Anthropology is designed to provide a thorough grounding in the basic concepts of the discipline. No subfield concentration is required for the baccalaureate degree in anthropology, however, several sequences of courses are recommended for students who want to concentrate in a particular subfield. Students are required to meet with an advisor during their second semester in their third year to discuss the most appropriate course sequence of the remaining elective anthropology classes.
